


How do the Credits Count?

- ▶ Center and Strategic Programs are locations where courses have been articulated and approved for Fairfield University credit and grade All AIFS programs, Australia, France, Greece(summer Honors only) Ireland Italy, and Spain.
- ► Provider Programs are our remaining programs where courses have been articulated as transfer credit pending an earned "C" or better.



Engaged Academically


- ➤ Semester and Year-long students are academically engaged 4 days per week in a full time course load.
- Coursework at Center programs is articulated to count for Fairfield credit and grade.
- Academic Departments select Preferred Programs for majors and minors.
- Our focus is on developing and implementing programming that complements and supplements the academic programs at Fairfield University.



How do the Finances Work?



- Semester/Year Students are billed by the Bursar for semester tuition and townhouse rate of housing. (Board sometimes)
- Short-Term Students pay a program fee that includes credits, accommodations, on the ground support and social/cultural programming.
- ► Financial Aid/Scholarships carry with semester programs and most times year long. Short-term is a case by case basis. Students should schedule an appointment with their Financial Aid advisor to clarify.

Financing and Scholarship

Semester

Students who study abroad through Fairfield University for a semester on an approved program are charged regular Fairfield tuition. Housing and meal charges will vary by location. All Fairfield scholarships and aid, including federal funds, can be used towards study abroad expenses for one semester with the exceptions of athletic scholarships, tuition remission, FACHEX, tuition exchange and work-study monies. With the approval of the Associate Moe Provost for Global Strategy, students with Modern Language, International Business, and International Studies majors may use Fairfield University financial aid for two semesters abroad on select programs.

Students who study abroad on a semester/year program are required to submit a \$1,000 fee to Fairfield University. This fee is part of the total tuition cost. The Fairfield University Office of the Bursar will bill all Fairfield students studying abroad prior to the start of each term. The Monthly Tuition Payment Plan is available.

The Campus





Planning Ahead

GPA requirements

- Most programs will require a minimum GPA of 2.8 or higher
- ▶ If your GPA is between a 2.5 and a 2.8 GPA there are may be alternative options available –email globalfairfield @fairfield.edu for details.
